#### Canterbury's IB Update

Happy November; a perfect time of the year to be reflective and thankful, and at Canterbury, there is much to be thankful for! All grade levels have completed their first IB unit and are moving on to planner #2.

Reflections from the first themes provided evidence to fun field trips (Patterson's Apple Farm, Eddy Farm, Shaker Lakes), guest speakers and activities. We had guests from Case Western Reserve visit our classrooms for a Music and Math lesson or Music and Science lesson, and the Cleveland Museum of Natural History brought in fossils and artifacts for our fourth graders to explore.

Highlighted this month will be Kindergarten's "Where We Are in Place and Time" unit. The central idea was "**Communities are where we interact and work together safely**." Students inquired into the following statements:



- Rules keep people safe and in order.
- There are different types of communities.
- Communities have rules and authority figures.
- People in communities have roles.

In the introduction to the unit, students were told there were "no rules" for the morning activities and recess. Students were shocked to learn that without rules, there was chaos; everyone talking to the teacher at the same time and kids climbing up the slide were some examples. Students were taught the lines of inquiry and had fun in the process.

As one of the final activities, students were asked to pick a favorite place in the community and recreate it. We had hotels, parks, playgrounds, Tiger Nation football stadium, pizza places, restaurants, banks, and many more brought to school. These places make up our community where we interact and work together safely. A perfect IB unit I'm thankful for!

#### **Peer Mediators**

The 2016-2017 Peer Mediators have completed their training and are full speed ahead. This year we have 40 third through fifth grade Peer Mediators, which is the most yet!
