

What is a major?

- the subject your child will take the most courses in and learn the most about
- the area of study that the degree will be in after completing the required courses

Choosing a College

College or University?

- College
 - Two or four year
 - Offers only undergraduate degrees
- University
 - Four year
 - Offers both undergraduate and graduate degrees

Choosing a College

Undergraduate or Graduate?

- Undergraduate Education
 - post-secondary education up to the level of a bachelor's degree
 - Associate's degree = 2 years
 - Bachelor's degree = 4 years
- Graduate Education
 - post-secondary education beyond the bachelor's degree
 - Master's degree
 - Doctorate degree

Choosing a College

Public or Private?

- Public
 - Funded in part with money from the state budget
 - In state/ out of state tuition
 - 13 in Ohio
- Private
 - rely on private sources of funding, such as tuition fees and alumni donations
 - Faith based
 - 51 in Ohio

Choosing a College

What is the Ivy League?

- an athletic conference comprising eight private institutions the Northeastern United States
 - Brown University
 - Columbia University
 - Cornell University
 - Dartmouth College
 - Harvard UniversityPrinceton University
 - University of Pennsylvania
 - Yale University

Choosing a College

What is the Ivy League?

- the phrase is no longer limited to athletics, and now represents an educational philosophy inherent to the nation's oldest schools
- connotations of academic excellence and selectivity in admissions

Choosing a College

What is an HBCU?

- Historically Black College or University
- 103 institutions of higher education in the United States
- established before 1964 with the intention of serving the black community
- in Ohio: Central State University, Wilberforce University

Choosing a College

Admission Requirements

- <u>Safety</u> the student meets or exceeds the minimum requirements and is almost certain to be admitted
- <u>Probable</u> GPA, test scores, and other features look very similar to recent entering classes and the student is likely to be admitted
- <u>Reach</u> the student may fall short of the profile of the most recent entering students and admission is less certain
