The data compared the percentage of our budget spent on classroom instruction versus non-classroom instruction. This report should clarify the misinformation often used to disparage our District's classroom spending in comparison to other districts (see official minutes).

BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Board President Kal Zucker apologized for having to reschedule one of the Tele Town Hall sessions that the District will host. The event was originally scheduled on October 4th but was rescheduled for those community members who observe Rosh Hashanah. The Tele Town Hall will now be held on Thursday, October 13, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. The District's finances and information regarding Issue 109 will be discussed. Residents can call in to listen and to ask questions.

Board President Zucker mentioned that Board Vice President Ron Register will be honored at the northeast region Ohio School Boards Association executive meeting being held on Wednesday, October 5, 2016. Mr. Register was named one of the NEOSBA Outstanding School Board Member Award recipients and nominated for the OSBA Outstanding All-Ohio Board Member Recognition.
