

IDEA-funded Services RFP FAQ

QUESTION:

When completing this bid, is it permissible to submit a partial bid to serve select schools?

ANSWER:

The Request for Proposals is specific to Intervention Specialist services for applicable eligible nonpublic students and not individual schools. Therefore, it is not permissible to submit a partial bid to serve select schools.

QUESTION:

Eligible students are noted as qualifying for an ISP. Are students who qualify for an IEP eligible as well?

ANSWER:

Eligible students are those who identified as a Student with a Disability (SWD) through the ETR process. "Eligible" means a student who has been evaluated (ETR) and found to be a SWD. "Eligible" students are entered into the Non-Public Data System (NDPS) by the Nonpublic/Private School.

QUESTION:

When completing this bid, is it permissible to submit a partial bid to serve select schools?

ANSWER:

The RFP is not school specific and seeks responses for services for students in nonpublic schools within CH-UH boundaries who are identified as a Student with a Disability.

QUESTION:

What grades should we plan on for services?

ANSWER:

K-12.

QUESTION:

How many students per grade and per school will receive services?

ANSWER:

The number of students at each school:

Beaumont - 18

Communion of Saints – 2

Gesu - 28

Hebrew Academy - 59
Sapirstein at Oakwood - 23
Yeshiva – 20

QUESTION:

Who is the current provider and what is the current rate?

ANSWER:

Providers have included A+Solutions, the Education Service Center of Summit County, McKeon, PSI, Tree of Knowledge with rates ranging from \$48.91 to \$58.00.
