- Consult with staff and parents

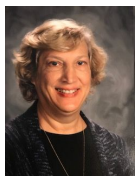
**Ms. Burkey, School Social Worker (320-5023)**

**Cleveland Food Bank School Market:** Open to all community members, no identification required. Provides fresh produce (occasionally other food items as well). **Family School Connections:** A kindergarten-focused program based in elementary schools. The Family Liaisons interact with parents as supportive peers and offer home visits, evening programs, and direct work with students in the classroom.
