Information about the trip to Paris, France has been sent to families of students taking French this year. **Deadline to register for the trip is October 30th.** Please check your email and/or junk mail.



YOUTH RESEARCH FOR SOCIAL CHANGE

Youth Research for Social Change is a two-year long program for high-school aged youth in Cleveland, which will be housed at the LGBT Community Center of Greater Cleveland. In this program, youth will work with staff from the LGBT Community Center and professors from Cleveland State University to design their own research projects, conduct research, and use that research to promote positive social change for LGBTQ+ youth in Cleveland and beyond.

All youth who participate need to fit the following criteria:

1) Be in grades 9 - 12

- 2) Live in the Cleveland area, with plans to stay local from Winter 2022 Winter 2024
- 3) Be passionate about issues impacting LGBTQ+ communities, especially youth

All youth who participate will learn important research skills (which support collegereadiness and translate to a variety of professional environments), will earn \$100 per month (\$1,600 total), and will make change in their communities.

Youth who are interested in this program should complete the following interest form by October 31, 2022. We will continue reviewing submissions on a rolling basis, but priority will be given to youth who submit their responses to this form by October 31, 2022.

Nurse's Notes

It's already October and our nursing team is committed to helping keep your child healthy and ready to learn!

Guidelines for school attendance after illness: It is often a puzzle trying to determine if your child is sick and should remain at home. Here are a few guidelines for keeping children home:

- Temperature over 100 degrees
- Vomiting within 24 hours
- Diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- Skin rash of unknown origin or lesions of draining areas on skin
- Pus and/or excessive drainage from the eyes
- Acute asthmatic problems
- Untreated head lice
- Persistent coughing, sore throat, excessive fatigue

MEDICATION POLICY:

<u>NO medications can be carried in school or</u> <u>administered in school without the proper</u> <u>paperwork on file in the nurse's office</u>. Forms are available in the nurse's office and on the district website for both prescription and nonprescription medications.

<u>All medication brought to school must be in the original pharmacy/store container</u>.
