SHIRLEY CHISHOLM (1924-2005)

Shirley Chisholm was the first Black woman elected into Congress in 1968.

She represented New York's 12th District from 1969 to 1983. Chisholm also became the first woman to run for the Democratic Party's presidential nomination in 1972 with the slogan "Unbought and unbossed."





ROBERT SENGSTACKE ABBOTT (1868-1940)

American lawyer, newspaper publisher, and editor, Abbot founded the Chicago Defender weekly newspaper in 1905. It became the highest circulation of any black-owned newspaper in the country and was in print until 2019. His newspaper was an integral part in encouraging African Americans to migrate from the South for better economic opportunities.
