



DOROTHY HEIGHT (1912-2010)

Co-organizer of the 1963 March on Washington and served as the president of the National Council of Negro Women for 40 years. Throughout her life, Height fought for equal rights for both African Americans and women. Dorothy Height fostered dialogue during the civil rights movement between black and white women and in planning meetings, mediated effectively with leaders of differing philosophies.



JOHNSON H. JOHNSON (1918-2005)

One of the most influential Black media publishers. Johnson's initial publication was Negro Digest. The first issue sold 3,000 copies and by its first year, the monthly circulation was 50,000. In 1945 he launched Ebony, its initially release of 25,000 copies was completely sold out and remains of the largest publications that caters to an African American audience. He expanded his projects including book publishing, radio broadcasting, insurance, and cosmetics manufacturing.




IMD MIDWINTER CONCERTS - FEB. 15 & 16
