
2023-24 COURSE PLANNING GUIDE

WILMA RUDOLPH (1940-1994)

The first American woman to win three gold medals in track & field at a single Olympics. Initially told that she may never walk again due to suffering as a child from double pneumonia, scarlet fever and polio which caused her to wear a brace on her left leg. But through determination and physical therapy, she was able to overcome her disabilities and compete at 16 and win a bronze medal in the 1956 Summer Olympics before later competing and winning three gold medals at the 1960 Olympics. In the 1980s, Wilma was inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame and established the Wilma Rudolph Foundation to promote amateur athletics.






GORDON PARKS (1912-2006)

Gordon Parks was the first African American photographer on the staff of Life magazine, and later helped found Essence. He also was the first Black writer and director of a studio film, and his second movie, Shaft, helping to shape the blaxploitation era in the '70s. Parks famously told Life in 1999: "I saw that the camera could be a weapon against poverty, against racism, against all sorts of social wrongs. I knew at that point I had to have a camera."



If you don't complete the FAFSA, you won't be able to receive federal financial aid. You may also be ineligible for certain types of institutional and state aid.
