STUDENT PARKING DURING CEDAR LEE MEADOWBROOK PROJECT CONSTRUCTION

The Cedar Lee Meadowbrook project will be starting construction in the coming weeks. Lot 5, where some high school students/staff park, is going to be incorporated into that project and will no longer be available as a parking lot. We expect the lot to close and construction fencing to go up **during the week of May 1**.

Per the parking agreement between the City and District, Lot 34 (aka the "AT&T lot") on Cedar will be the designated parking lot for school parkers moving forward. The attached map highlights the location. The parking garage at Cedar Lee will remain open to the public at all times. However, please note that there will be no



direct pedestrian path from the garage to Cedar Road/the high school. We also expect the sidewalk on the south side of Cedar will be closed east of Lee Road during construction, as well as the crosswalk that crosses Cedar from the football field in front of the former beauty school. Parkers will need to cross to the north side of Cedar at Lee to walk to the high school. The expected crosswalk/sidewalk closures are highlighted in red on the map pictured above.

SECURITY SCOOP

FROM MR. WATTERS, COORDINATOR FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY

On Monday, April 17 Heights High will be conducting a tornado drill during 3rd period. Please review your Emergency Guideline and procedures booklet and prepare for this drill.

Additional notes to help transition smoothly:

- When leaving your classroom, students should listen carefully to instructions and walk to your designated area
 Line up side by side FACING the wall Students may remain standing (there should be a walking page)
- Line up side-by-side FACING the wall Students may remain standing (there should be a walking path throughout the halls)
- Students should remain silent and listen for direction. Teachers should take attendance
- Administrators and security will walk around checking to assure classes are in a safe area
- All clear will be announced on the PA, at that time you will return to class
- Walk back to class quietly. Teachers should take attendance and notify admin of absent students
