Casey Kasem (1932 - 2014)

Kemal Amin "Casey" Kasem was a Lebanese American DJ, actor, and radio presenter from Detroit, Michigan who created and hosted several radio countdown programs, notably American Top 40.

Kasem is synonymous with the countdown format, which is reminiscent of the immensely popular Your Hit Parade program in the 1930s and 1940s, and allowed him to blend human-interest stories with the top songs of the day.

The undisputed "King of the Countdown" hosted American Top 40 for 39 years and would introduce songs and stories about the lives of musicians and singers with "teaser" lead-ins. This "teaser" biography is now a standard in the industry.

Casey Kasem was also the first actor to voice Shaggy Rogers in the Scooby-Doo franchise (1969-1997 and 2002-2009) and Dick Grayson/Robin in Super Friends (1973–1985).

The Friday concert will also feature the Symphonic Winds and a combined performance by the IMD's top two ensembles.


The Thursday concert will feature performances by the Concert Band, Concert Orchestra, and Philharmonic Strings.
