# Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month

## **Advancing Leaders Through Innovation**

Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month (AAPI Heritage Month) is an annual celebration in May that recognizes the historical and cultural contributions of individuals and groups of Asian and Pacific Islander descent to the United States. The effort to officially recognize Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander contributions to the United States began in the late 1970s, and took over 10 years to make it a permanent month-long celebration.

The AAPI umbrella term includes cultures from the entire Asian continent—including East, Southeast and South Asia—and the Pacific Islands of Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia. As of the 2020 U.S. Census, there were about 20.6 million people of Asian or Pacific Islander descent in the United States. According to the Pew Research Center, AAPI people are a diverse and growing population that make up about 7 percent of the total U.S. population.

According to the <u>Federal Asian Pacific American Council (FAPAC)</u>, the theme for AAPI Heritage Month 2024 is "<u>Advancing Leaders Through Innovation</u>." Stated by the FAPAC, this theme "pays homage to the visionaries and trailblazers who have shaped our AANHPI history and continue to influence our collective future."

Steve Chen (1978 - Present)

Steve Chen, a Taiwanese immigrant, is the co-founder of YouTube and has contributed to the pivotal shift in online video content production and created a platform for people at home to turn content production into multi-million dollar careers.

The idea for YouTube came after Chen and his friend and cofounder, Chad Hurley, were at a dinner party and could not find an easy way to share videos. Realizing that digital photos were easier to share thanks to websites like Flickr, they reasoned that a similar software package for videos was possible too. The idea was that it had to be easy to use and not require downloading software.

Chen was named in Business 2.0's 50 Most Influential People, GQ's Men of the Year, TIME magazine's Best Invention of the Year and Fortune's Most Powerful People in Business. Chen became a multi-millionaire after YouTube was bought by Google in 2009 for \$1.65 billion.

After YouTube, he co-founded business incubator Avos Systems, the creators of the mobile video platform MixBit, and worked as an entrepreneur in residence at Google Ventures.

## JEWISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

Jewish American Heritage Month is an annual celebration that recognizes the historical and cultural contributions of people of Jewish descent and identity to the United States. The effort to officially recognize Jewish American contributions to the United States began in 1980 initially with special week in April or May for Jewish heritage celebrations. Finally, on April 20, 2006, President George W. Bush proclaimed that May would be Jewish American Heritage Month.

The announcement was the crowning achievement in an effort by the Jewish Museum of Florida and South Florida Jewish community leaders that resulted in resolutions introduced by Representative Debbie Wasserman Schultz of Florida and Senator Arlen Specter of Pennsylvania urging the president to proclaim a month that would recognize the 370-year history of Jewish contributions to American achievements and culture.

## LILLIAN WALD

(1867 - 1940)

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, Wald was an American nurse, humanitarian and author. She was known for contributions to human rights and was the founder of American community nursing.

Lillian Wald founded the Henry Street Settlement in New York City and was an early advocate to have nurses in public schools. She helped to bring health care to the residents of New York's Lower East Side and fought for public health care, women's rights, and children's rights while running the Henry Street Settlement.

An activist for the rights of children, women, and minorities, Wald campaigned for federal child labor laws and women's suffrage, and was a supporter of racial integration. She was involved in the founding of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Her ideas led the New York Board of Health to organize the first public nursing system in the world, and she helped to found the Columbia University School of Nursing.

The New York Times named Wald as one of the 12 greatest living American women in 1922 and she later received the Lincoln Medallion for her work as an "Outstanding Citizen of New York." "THE TASK OF ORGANIZING HUMAN HAPPINESS NEEDS THE ACTIVE COOPERATION OF MAN AND WOMAN: IT CANNOT BE RELEGATED TO ONE HALF OF THE WORLD."
