
There are two ASPIRE programs, each with different career focuses.

BROTHER BE WELL - YOUTH SUBSTANCE USE PREVENTION SUMMER ACADEMY

The BBW Youth Substance Use Prevention Summer Academy is a 10-week virtual summer program focused on youth substance use prevention and mental health. Led by experts, participants learn about substances and how to prevent abuse. It will also discuss mental health co-occurring disorders, and review and propose enhancements to school substance use prevention and mental health policies with a focus on males of color.

The program begins June 6, and runs Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays through Thursday, August 10. Each participant will receive approximately \$2,000 for attending the 10-week virtual academy.

Applications are due by Friday, May 26, 2023 by 5:00 p.m. New applicants only. Previous attendees are not eligible to apply.

NURSES NOTES: IMMUNIZATION UPDATE

Class of 2024: Now is the time to check the status of your Meningococcal A vaccine, which is required PRIOR to entering 12th grade and is also required for college. The vaccine could be administered at school during your junior year (as well as during the summer) through the MetroHealth Wellness Center located at Heights High.

Documentation of having received the vaccine must be on file in the nurse's office prior to starting your senior year!
