# NURSES NOTES: IMMUNIZATION UPDATE

**Class of 2024:** Now is the time to check the status of your Meningococcal A vaccine, which is **required PRIOR to entering 12th grade** and is also required for college. The vaccine could be administered at school during your junior year (as well as during the summer) through the MetroHealth Wellness Center located at Heights High.

Documentation of having received the vaccine must be on file in the nurse's office prior to starting your senior year!

# **SECURITY SCOOP**

#### FROM MR. WATTERS, COORDINATOR FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY

To do our part to mitigate vaping in school, Heights High School is piloting a set of vape sensors in the school restrooms by the cafeteria. The administration monitors notifications from the vape sensors, and if it is determined that a student may have been vaping, the student will be assessed and possibly searched. Any necessary disciplinary action will be taken in accordance with the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.

If administration determines that the vape sensors are effective, they will be permanently installed in all Heights High School restrooms before the start of the 2023-2024 school year.
