We encourage you to arrive with your student's schedule, which can be found on <u>Infinite Campus</u>, or even have your student attend to guide you through the building and their schedule.



# **HEIGHTS HIGH CELL PHONE POLICY**

Due to the prominence of cell phones in our school and society, and their ability to be helpful tools and/or awful distractions, **Cleveland Heights High School** is implementing the following cell phone policy. This policy acknowledges teachers' awareness that phones are distracting students from learning, parents' need to occasionally contact their kids directly during the school day, and students' desire to carry their phones throughout the day.

Each class will have a sign outside the classroom that will indicate three possibilities for student cell phone usage in that classroom.

The three options are **Red**, **Yellow**, or **Green**.

Students are to abide by the expectations indicated outside of each classroom. Any student who fails to follow the cell phone policy will be redirected to correct their behavior. Upon the third occurrence, students who have not corrected their behavior will be referred to the school administration.

Red: Cell phones out of sight and silenced. No headphones.

Yellow: Cell phones can be out and used as directed. Headphones permitted.

Green: School appropriate cell phone usage permitted.
