Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together


Hispanic Heritage Month is an annual awareness event that takes place from September 15 - October 15 to celebrate the history, <u>culture</u>, traditions, and contributions of the Hispanic community. Originally introduced in 1968 as a week-long event by Congressman George E. Brown, it has become a month-long celebration that is now internationally celebrated.

It encompasses important events such as the <u>independence anniversaries for Central American countries</u> and Día de la Raza (Columbus Day). Hispanic Heritage Month also ensures that <u>society recognizes the incredible contributions of the</u> Hispanic community throughout history, both to society and the economy. As well as to catalyze action against the discrimination that Hispanic and Latino people continue to face.

According to the <u>National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM)</u>, the theme for Hispanic Heritage Month 2024 is "*Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together*." Stated by the NCHEPM, this theme encapsulating the "spirit of innovation, resilience, and unity that define the Hispanic experience."

DOLORES HUERTA (1930 - Present)

Dolores Huerta is a prominent labor leader and civil rights activist whose work has significantly advanced the rights of farmworkers and marginalized communities in the United States. Born in 1930 in Dawson, New Mexico, Huerta cofounded the National Farm Workers Association (later the United Farm Workers) with César Chávez in 1962. She played a crucial role in organizing the Delano grape strike in 1965, a pivotal event that led to improved working conditions and wages for farm laborers.

Huerta's powerful slogan, "Sí, se puede" ("Yes, you can"), became a rallying cry for social justice movements. Her tireless advocacy extends beyond labor rights to include women's rights, immigration reform, and environmental justice. Despite facing numerous challenges, including gender discrimination and violence, Huerta's unwavering dedication has earned her numerous accolades, including the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2012. Her legacy continues to inspire activists worldwide, emphasizing the importance of grassroots organizing and community empowerment.
