Heights High students - your voice and vote matters!


This week, Heights High students who are or will be 18 by the November 5 election will have the opportunity to complete their voter registration.

On **Monday**, **September 23** during the lunch periods, a <u>Hip Hop Voter Registration Bus</u> event will take place in the area outside of the cafeteria by the bike racks. This event is in partnership with the Councilwoman Davida Russell and the <u>Ohio Alliance for Community Engagement</u> and will bring music, food, civic engagement information, and registration support for young voters in a fun, engaging way.

Students will have another opportunity to register to vote on Wednesday, September 25 with the League of Women Voters in the cafeteria during their lunch periods.

Students will need to know the last four digits of their social security number to complete their voter registration.

Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together


Hispanic Heritage Month is an annual awareness event that takes place from September 15 - October 15 to celebrate the history, <u>culture</u>, traditions, and contributions of the Hispanic community. <u>Originally introduced in 1968</u> as a week-long event by Congressman George E. Brown, it has become a month-long celebration that is now internationally celebrated.

It encompasses important events such as the <u>independence anniversaries for Central American countries</u> and Día de la Raza (Columbus Day). Hispanic Heritage Month also ensures that society recognizes the incredible contributions of the Hispanic community throughout history, both to society and the economy. As well as to catalyze action against the discrimination that Hispanic and Latino people continue to face.

According to the <u>National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM)</u>, the theme for Hispanic Heritage Month 2024 is "*Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together*." Stated by the NCHEPM, this theme encapsulating the "spirit of innovation, resilience, and unity that define the Hispanic experience."

LIN-MANUEL MIRANDA

(1980 - Present)

Lin-Manuel Miranda is a transformative figure in contemporary theater, best known for his groundbreaking musicals "Hamilton" and "In the Heights." Born in New York City in 1980 to Puerto Rican parents, Miranda's work celebrates and explores the richness of Latinx culture and history. His first major success, "In the Heights," debuted on Broadway in 2008, earning four Tony Awards, including Best Musical, and spotlighting the vibrant community of Washington Heights.

Miranda's "Hamilton," which premiered in 2015, revolutionized musical theater by blending hip-hop, R&B, and traditional show tunes to tell the story of American Founding Father Alexander Hamilton with a diverse cast. "Hamilton" won 11 Tony Awards, a Pulitzer Prize for Drama, and a Grammy Award, becoming a cultural phenomenon.

Beyond the stage, Miranda is a vocal advocate for social justice and Puerto Rican relief efforts, particularly following Hurricane Maria. His innovative contributions and activism have solidified his status as a significant cultural and artistic force.
