Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together


Hispanic Heritage Month is an annual awareness event that takes place from September 15 - October 15 to celebrate the history, <u>culture</u>, traditions, and contributions of the Hispanic community. <u>Originally introduced in 1968</u> as a week-long event by Congressman George E. Brown, it has become a month-long celebration that is now internationally celebrated.

It encompasses important events such as the <u>independence anniversaries for Central American countries</u> and Día de la Raza (Columbus Day). Hispanic Heritage Month also ensures that society recognizes the incredible contributions of the Hispanic community throughout history, both to society and the economy. As well as to catalyze action against the discrimination that Hispanic and Latino people continue to face.

According to the <u>National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM)</u>, the theme for Hispanic Heritage Month 2024 is "*Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together*." Stated by the NCHEPM, this theme encapsulating the "spirit of innovation, resilience, and unity that define the Hispanic experience."

ROBERTO CLEMENTE

(1934 - 1972)

Roberto Clemente was a trailblazing Puerto Rican baseball player whose impact extended far beyond the field. Born in 1934 in Carolina, Puerto Rico, Clemente became the first Latin American player to collect 3,000 career hits in Major League Baseball.

Playing for the Pittsburgh Pirates from 1955 until his untimely death in 1972, he was renowned for his powerful arm, exceptional batting, and humanitarian efforts. Clemente won numerous accolades, including 12 Gold Glove Awards, four National League batting titles, and the 1966 National League MVP Award.

Off the field, he was a vocal advocate for civil rights and devoted himself to charitable work, particularly in Latin America and the Caribbean. Clemente's tragic death in a plane crash while delivering aid to earthquake victims in Nicaragua cemented his legacy as a hero both in sports and humanitarianism. His enduring influence is celebrated through various awards and honors, including his posthumous induction into the Baseball Hall of Fame.


