

Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together


Hispanic Heritage Month is an annual awareness event that takes place from **September 15 - October 15** to celebrate the history, <u>culture</u>, traditions, and contributions of the Hispanic community. Originally introduced in 1968 as a week-long event by Congressman George E. Brown, it has become a month-long celebration that is now internationally celebrated.

It encompasses important events such as the <u>independence anniversaries for Central American countries</u> and Día de la Raza (Columbus Day). Hispanic Heritage Month also ensures that society recognizes the incredible contributions of the Hispanic community throughout history, both to society and the economy. As well as to catalyze action against the discrimination that Hispanic and Latino people continue to face.

According to the <u>National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM)</u>, the theme for Hispanic Heritage Month 2024 is "*Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together*." Stated by the NCHEPM, this theme encapsulating the "spirit of innovation, resilience, and unity that define the Hispanic experience."

GEORGE MELÉNDEZ WRIGHT (1904 - 1936)

George Meléndez Wright was a pioneering American wildlife biologist whose work significantly shaped the conservation efforts of the National Park Service. Born in 1904 in San Francisco to a Salvadoran mother and an American father, Wright developed an early passion for nature.

He joined the National Park Service in the 1920s and quickly recognized the need for scientific research to inform wildlife management. In 1929, he founded the Wildlife Division of the National Park Service and initiated the first comprehensive wildlife survey of the national parks, an unprecedented effort at the time.

His groundbreaking work emphasized the importance of preserving natural habitats and understanding ecosystems, laying the foundation for modern wildlife conservation practices. Wright's legacy endures in the principles of ecological preservation and scientific research that continue to guide the stewardship of America's national parks.


