Heights High will follow an <u>Early Release Bell</u> <u>Schedule</u>. School will be over at 1:26 p.m.



NATIONAL NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

National Native American Heritage Month, observed every November, celebrates the rich histories, cultures, and contributions of Native American and Alaska Native peoples. The observance originated from advocacy efforts in the early 20th century, with individuals like Dr. Arthur C. Parker, a Seneca Indian and director of Museum of Arts and Science in Rochester, N.Y. and Red Fox James, a Blackfoot Indian, leading the charge for a day honoring "First Americans." In 1990, President George H.W. Bush officially designated November as National Native American Heritage Month, or as it is commonly referred to, American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month.

National Native American Heritage Month highlights the resilience, creativity, and cultural richness of America's Indigenous peoples, while also recognizing the challenges they have faced, including colonization and marginalization. It also serves as an opportunity to honor Native American achievements and foster greater understanding of their cultural contributions, histories, and ongoing issues they face within the broader American narrative.

DEB MAALAND (1960 - Present) Laguna Pueblo

Deb Haaland is a trailblazing figure in American politics, known for her significant contributions to indigenous representation and environmental advocacy. Born in 1960 in Winslow, Arizona, Haaland is a member of the Laguna Pueblo tribe. Her career began in grassroots activism, focusing on issues like voter rights and environmental justice.

In 2018, Haaland made history by becoming one of the first two Native American women elected to the U.S. House of Representatives. Representing New Mexico's 1st congressional district, she advocated for climate action, renewable energy, and the rights of indigenous communities.

In 2021, Haaland broke another barrier by becoming the first Native American to serve as a U.S. Cabinet Secretary when she was appointed Secretary of the Interior. In this role, she oversees the management of public lands, natural resources, and upholds tribal sovereignty. Haaland's leadership marks a significant step towards greater inclusion and representation in American government.

The <u>MetroHealth Institute for H.O.P.E. School</u> <u>Health Program</u> is partnering with CH-UH to offer health care services on-site at your child's school. Your child will now have easier medical service access during the school day.

Additionally, CH-UH City School District students, their families, and staff members can receive routine health care at the **Heights Wellness Center** inside Heights High School.

What services does MetroHealth provide?

- Physicals (annual/sports/work permit)
 - Injury/illness care
 - Routine lab tests
 - Teen services
 - Mental/behavioral health

- Immunizations
- Care for chronic conditions, including asthma, allergies, diabetes and seizure disorders
 - Health education and prevention
 - Telehealth, to supplement in-person care
