

MANDEL YOUTH HUMANITIES ACADEMY SUMMER PROGRAM

The Mandel Youth Humanities Academy is a summer program that offers rising high school juniors and seniors an opportunity to broaden their humanities education. Students will prepare for college-level academic work by exploring material in art, religion, literature, philosophy and history with Tri-C faculty. Our study of the humanities will be integrated with new digital technologies (Virtual Reality) and community engagement experiences in the Cleveland area.

Combining humanities education with civic engagement will aid student participants in developing their leadership skills and gaining a broader awareness of the challenges and opportunities facing northeast Ohio.

Chosen participants will meet five days of the week (from 10 am - 3 pm) for nine weeks.


They will also receive a generous stipend for their participation as our expectation is that participating students will be able to treat the Youth Humanities Academy as their summer job.
