

Filing a FAFSA® is the single most important thing you can do to get money for college. It's the gateway to more than \$150 billion in college grants, work-study funds, and federal student loans, as well as certain state-based aid. If you don't complete the FAFSA, you won't be able to receive federal financial aid. You may also be ineligible for certain types of institutional and state aid.
