HURRICANE FIONA RELIEF DRIVE



NWEA MAP FAMILY REPORT

Students (9th and 10th graders) at Cleveland Heights High School take the NWEA MAP assessment three times during the school year (Fall, Winter and Spring).

The NWEA MAP Test (Measures of Academic Progress) is an adaptive achievement and growth test. It creates a personalized assessment experience by adapting to each student's learning level—precisely measuring progress and growth for each individual student. NWEA MAP Growth measures achievement and growth in math, reading, and language usage. NWEA MAP Growth uses a RIT scale to accurately measure what students know, regardless of their grade level. It also measures growth over time, allowing you to track your child's progress throughout the school year and across multiple years. Once your child completes a MAP Growth test, they receive a RIT score. The RIT scale precisely measures student performance, regardless of whether they're performing on, above, or below grade level. Teachers can use the scores to identify learning areas that their class should focus on, as well as monitor the growth of individual students.

Students have completed the Fall assessment. The Family Report focuses on what families value most: clear information on a student's performance, and how to encourage learning and growth. **Reports will be mailed this week**.



SECURITY SCOOP

FROM MR. WATTERS, COORDINATOR FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY



We will participate in a school-wide lockdown drill on Tuesday, October 4.

Please review the following protocol for a Level 2 Lockdown:

Level 2 - Modified Lockdown: All exterior and interior doors are locked, movement within the school is allowed only by announcement from the administration. No entry into or exit from the building is allowed. Students are to return to a classroom immediately. Students who are outside for PE, recess, etc. are to more indoors and to a classroom immediately. Students remain in class. Activity in the classroom continues as usual. Examples for a Level 2 Lockdown: A nearby explosion, a local catastrophe, a weapon seen in the building but has not been found, or a dangerous intruder.
