BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Board President Karen Jones shared her thoughts on the Superintendent's State of the Schools address. Ms. Jones stated that she looks forward to the fruit of our students' and teachers' hard work as they embrace the changes, new programs, and ideas of the District. She is aware of the challenges, but feels we are striving to overcome them one by one. During her tenure as Board President, her goal is to help establish a change of culture and a different mindset as to the possibilities within this District. Board President Jones said she embraces the direction of Superintendent Doug Heuer and his staff.

Board Member Nancy Peppler announced that the Cleveland Heights Recreation Committee has scholarships available for children living in the District wishing to participate in spring and summer sports.

Board Member Kal Zucker reported that OSBA's Urban Commission has been renamed the Urban School Advisory Network. The Advisory Network is still in the planning phase and is expected to meet at the end of March in Columbus.

Board Member Kal Zucker welcomed two new trustees to the CHHS Alumni Foundation: Jen Collier and Susan Carver. He also announced this year that the Alumni Foundation will award 15 scholarships to up to 22 students. High school seniors are encouraged to apply.

Mr. Zucker announced that the 16th Annual Alumni Pancake Breakfast will be held at the High School on Sunday, April 22, from 9:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m.

Mr. Zucker also announced the annual Alumni Hall of Fame will be held May 3, 2012 at Landerhaven.

The Annual Reaching Heights Spelling Bee will be March 28th, and they are looking to have a school board team again this year. Board Member Kal Zucker is currently volunteering on the Teacher Support Academic Committee and the Music Committee for Reaching Heights.

Board Member Nancy Peppler announced the next Facilities Presentation will be February 22, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. in the Heights High Social Room.

Board Member Ron Register announced that MSAN took students on a trip to Kent State on January 26 to participate in the KSU Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration. The keynote speaker for the celebration was Dr. Marc Lamont Hill, a professor at Columbia University.

Superintendent Heuer also announced that on February 11th at 11:00 a.m., the CHHS Men's Vocal Group will perform the national anthem at the Cleveland State vs. Butler basketball game. The game will broadcast nationally on ESPN. The vocal group will then return to the high school to perform the national anthem prior to the Cleveland Heights vs. Shaker Heights game.

The vocal music program will perform on Presidents' Day, February 20, 2012, at Nighttown at 7:00 p.m. Superintendent Heuer announced they will perform along with Dominick Farinacci, who is considered a national and international rising star as a jazz trumpeter.

Board President Karen Jones congratulated the nine senior athletes who signed letters of intent with colleges/universities. We expect there will be more to come from basketball, baseball, and track.
