Wiley Middle School Mural Presentation

Interim Superintendent Christine Fowler-Mack recognized Wiley Middle School Principal Kelli Cogan and Art Teacher Heather Vokic for the mural project located in the Wiley cafeteria.

Roxboro Middle School Science Olympiad Team

Interim Superintendent Christine Fowler-Mack reported that for the first time, this year students from all three middle schools participated in the Science Olympiad. The Science Olympiad is an academic interscholastic competition designed to increase student interest in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Ms. Fowler-Mack recognized the Science Olympiad team from Roxboro Middle School for achieving excellence at the regional and state competitions. Roxboro's team placed eighth in the regional Science Olympiad tournament held in Akron. In order to advance to the state competition, the team competed individually or in groups in a series of 23 events testing students' knowledge of science skills, processes, and applications. Roxboro Middle's team advanced to the state finals at Ohio State University where 38 middle school teams competed. Roxboro finished 27th in the state and placed 5th in the Pentathlon, 4th in Environmental Chemistry, and 3rd in Disease Detectives. FINANCE

Financial Reports

It was recommended that the Board confirm the Cash Position Report and Budget Transfers for March 1, 2009 through March 31, 2009 (see official minutes).

Five-Year Forecast

It was recommended that the Board of Education approve the Five-Year Forecast for fiscal years ending June 30, 2009 through June 30, 2013 (see official minutes).

Scott Gainer, Chief Financial Officer, provided the Board with an update on the Five-Year Forecast. Statutorily, we are required to submit a forecast in May and in November.

This forecast does include actual tax collections, which came in at 93½%. With the current reappraisal, it is estimated that University Heights' property values will be reduced by 10%, Cleveland Heights' by 6%. This averages to a 7-7½% reduction in property values overall, affecting the inside millage. This translates to an approximate \$400,000 loss in property tax collections.

Additionally, there are over 1,300 residential tax decrease complaints in our District; almost three times the number we would traditionally see in a three-year update. At a minimum, our tax attorney said we could stand to lose another \$1-1½ million in the future.

Option 1 of the recent budget reduction process was also embedded in this forecast.

Mr. Gainer concluded that the forecast is fluid, and whenever anything material comes to us, it will be brought to the Board's attention.

Resolution Accepting the Amounts and Rates as Determined by the Budget Commission and Authorizing the Necessary Tax Levies and Certifying Them to the County Auditor

It was recommended that the Board of Education approve the resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor (see official minutes).

Mr. Gainer, CFO, explained that this resolution is presented before the Board twice a year where the County sends us documents certifying what the actual tax rates are. These rates may change if there is a levy on the ballot.

Members of the community are invited to attend the Annual State of the Schools address on Tuesday, May 12, 2009 at 6:30 p.m. at Cleveland Heights High School. Teachers, students and District officials will share the many programs, courses and opportunities that enable student success. Interim Superintendent Christine Fowler-Mack will update the community on the progress leading to improved

student achievement and the initiatives preparing students to be successful in college and in the global economy.

Board President Zucker attended the final ExEl In State Institute on April 30-May 1, 2009. This was the end of a three-year program focused on high quality teaching and learning.

Mr. Zucker reported that the Superintendent Search is continuing on the path as diagrammed by Hudepohl and Associates. The position profile was updated and is posted on the District website.

Mr. Zucker expressed his personal sadness for the District and great happiness for Michael Dougherty on the announcement of Mr. Dougherty's resignation from the position of Coordinator of Communications and Community Engagement. Board President Zucker highlighted some of the aspects of Mr. Dougherty's job and acknowledged that Michael has brought honor to the position and to the District. Mr. Zucker thanked Michael Dougherty for his valued service and wished him success and happiness in his new position with the Ohio Department of Education.
